Etenne, as he was fondly called, was born on September 12, 1954, to Dr. Timothy Ekundayo Dada and Gloria Adang Eyo Nsa in Jos, Plateau State Nigeria, where he grew up with his mother until she was transferred to Kano State in 1960. There, he attended Holy Trinity Primary school until the civil war broke out in 1966 and was sent to live with his aunty, Nkoyo Eyo Nsa, in Calabar, where he completed his primary education at Big Qua Presbyterian primary school.

In 1967, he began his secondary education at the West African People’s Institute and transferred after Class 2 to Hope Waddell Training Institute, where he completed the West African Examinations Council O-Levels Examination in 1971 and A-Levels in 1973. He subsequently earned a BSc in Veterinary Science from the University of Nigeria Nsukka in 1976, and a second BSc in Animal Science from the University of Ibadan in 1979.

He returned to Jos to complete his National Youth Service Corps assignment in 1980 and then joined the Cross River State civil service in 1981/1982. In 1983 he left for Livestock (Pfizer) Feeds PLC, where he worked for 17 years before establishing his own company, EEDADA NIG LTD, which he led until his passing.

Etenne married Josephine Ena Ekeng in 1985, and they both shared 40 years of a loving marriage, that was blessed with two children, Nsa and Eyo Dada, and a grandchild, Uel Dada. Rooted in Christian, family, and community values, he was baptized Methodist and remained a member of the Wesley Methodist Cathedral and the Men’s Fellowship Group B until his passing. He was also a long-standing, active member of the National Association of Seadogs until his passing.
